



Current Bylaw:

Section 230 - Voting

- (a) Between the Department Annual Convention and Department Quarterly Meetings, the Department Board of Trustees is empowered to conduct business at any regular or special meeting, or by mail, fax, or e-mail.
- (b) All business by mail requiring a yes or no vote shall be handled routinely by the Department Adjutant who shall mail to every Board Member an identical copy of the question on a printed ballot containing spaces for yes or no vote, a space for the voter's signature, and a space for entry date.
- (c) Upon receipt of a mail ballot forwarded by certified mail return receipt requested, each Board of Trustees Member shall cast his/her vote and complete as indicated. The ballot shall be returned to the Department Adjutant within 1 week. A Board of Trustee member failing to return his/her ballot within the allotted time, will be recorded as not voting.
- (d) The Adjutant shall keep a record of all ballots mailed / e-mailed with the date of mailing, a record of the date of return ballot, and shall mail to each Board Member identical tallies reflecting results of the balloting by showing the vote of each Board Member and the total of yes and no votes.
- (e) The results of each mail balloting shall be made available to the Department Board of Trustees within five (5) business days after compiling the vote. Following each balloting by the Department Board of Trustees, the results of such vote, in detail for the information of the membership, shall be sent to Detachment Commandants in a letter for release.

Proposed Amendment:

Section 230 - Voting

REVISED (a) Between the Department Annual Convention and Department Quarterly Meetings, the Department Board of Trustees is empowered to conduct business at any regular or special meeting, or by mail, fax, or email or virtual (online) meeting.

REVISED (b) All business by email requiring a yes or no vote shall be handled routinely by the Department Adjutant who shall email to every Board Member an identical copy of the question on a printed ballot containing spaces for yes or no vote, a space for the voter's signature, and a space for entry date.

REVISED (c) Upon receipt of an email ballot forwarded by certified mail return receipt requested, each

Board of Trustees Member shall cast his/her vote and complete as indicated. The email ballot shall be returned to the Department Adjutant within no more than one (1) week. A Board of Trustee member failing to return his/her ballot within the allotted time, will be recorded as not voting.

REVISED (d) The Adjutant shall keep a record of all ballots mailed with the date of emailing, a record of the date of return ballot, and shall email to each Board Member identical tallies reflecting results of the balloting by showing the vote of each Board Member and the total of yes and no votes.

REVISED (e) The results of each email balloting shall be made available to the Department Board of Trustees within five (5) business days after compiling the vote. Following each balloting by the Department Board of Trustees, the results of such vote, in detail for the information of the membership, shall be sent to Detachment Commandants in a letter for release.

Rationale: With the current technology available, should the need for an emergency / immediate vote arise, a virtual meeting or an email vote is a much more efficient and cost-effective way to facilitate the completion of the vote versus using the US Postal Service with Return Receipt Requested.

Current Bylaw:

Section 210 Duties - Board Members

(a) **Department Commandant** shall be the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Department of South Carolina and shall preside at all sessions of the Department Quarterly Meetings, Convention and at all meetings of the Department Board of Trustees. The Department Commandant together with the Department Board of Trustees shall have direction and control of the executive and administrative affairs of the Department of South Carolina between Department Quarterly Meetings and Conventions. In addition, the Department Commandant shall:

(1) Observe and enforce the... (no changes to any of the current bylaws under this particular section)

Proposed Amendment:

Section 210: Duties - Board Members

ADD (11) Represent, or appoint an appropriate designee (optimally another Board of Trustees Member as outlined in Section 200) to represent, the Department of South Carolina, at the following National and Division Events: MidWinter Conference, Southeast Division Conference, MCL National Convention. Designee should chosen in order of precedence: (1) Department Sr. Vice Commandant; (2) Department Junior Vice Commandant; (3) Department Judge Advocate; (4) Department Jr. Past Commandant; (5) Department Paymaster; (6) Department Adjutant; (7) Other Department Appointed Officer. Designee shall be authorized to submit an expense report for hotel and travel as outlined in Section 235 – Travel Expenses.

Rationale:

This addition further outlines the specific meeting attendance requirements for the Department Commandant as the CEO of the Department and outlines who can be appointed as a representative should the Commandant be unable to attend.





Proposed Amendment:

Section 220 - Board Meetings

REVISED / ADDITION (a) The Department Board shall meet:

(1) Annually prior to the Department Convention to close out the executive administration of the Department Board of Trustees from the fiscal year, to finalize preparation for the ensuing convention; and to identify pending or unaccomplished executive actions warranting further action by the Convention or by the Department Board of Trustees during the ensuing fiscal year. This shall include a Commandants Council during which all Detachment Commandants (or appointed representatives) shall prepare a Detachment report and present copies to the Department Commandant and Board of Trustees and Department Adjutant.

Rationale:

This edit is in addition to the proposed revision of Section 220 (c) to change the Commandants Council from a required meeting prior to the business session to a required meeting to be held prior to the end of the business sessions during Convention.

The Department Commandants Council, an integral part of the Department Staff, composed of all Detachment Commandants (or their representative) shall prepare a Detachment report and present a copy of their report to the Department Senior Vice Commandant, who shall chair the Commandants Council meeting.

Proposed Amendment:

Section 220: Board Meetings


REVISED (c) In addition to regular business meetings at the Department Convention, a Department Commandants Council meeting **must** be held prior to the close of the final business session. The Department Commandants Council, an integral part of the Department Staff, composed of all Detachment Commandants (or their representative) shall prepare a Detachment report and present a copy of their report to the Department Senior Vice Commandant, who shall chair the Commandants Council meeting.

Rationale:

Previously the Commandants Council has been held the Thursday night prior to any business sessions of Convention. Changing the requirement for the Commandants Council to simply be held prior to the close of the business sessions will potentially eliminate one night of expenses for the Commandant or his/her representative.

In accordance with Article Eight, Miscellaneous, Section 800, Amendments, of the Department of South Carolina Bylaws, I respectfully propose the following amendment to Article Four, Section 400:

Current Bylaw:

Section 400 Meetings

(f) Regular meetings of the Department shall be held quarterly. One of the four meetings will be the Department Convention. All Department meetings for the year following the Department Convention will be scheduled at the convention. All Detachment Commandants are required to make these four meetings. In the event changes or additions to the schedule become necessary, such changes shall be communicated by mail, telephone, or e-mail to the Detachment Commandants by the Department Commandant or his designee, at least two (2) weeks prior to such meeting.

Proposed Amendment:

Section 400 Meetings

REVISED (f) Regular meetings of the Department shall be held quarterly. One of the four meetings will be the Department Convention. All Department meetings for the year following the Department Convention will be scheduled at the convention. All Detachment Commandants, or his/her designee, are required to attend these four meetings. This designee should be (in order of precedence) an elected officer from the Detachment, appointed officer from the Detachment, or general member of the Detachment. In the event changes or additions to the schedule become necessary, such changes shall be communicated by mail, telephone or e-mail to the Detachment Commandants by the Department Commandant or his/her designee, at least two (2) weeks prior to such meeting.

Rationale:

It is sometimes not feasible for a Commandant to attend a Quarterly meeting. Currently the bylaw gives no leeway in the Commandant's attendance, though the Department has been flexible in allowing a representative of the Detachment to stand in. The key to this part of the Bylaw is to ensure that all Detachments have a representative at the Department Meetings for the transaction of official business. This also deletes the requirement for notifications of changes be done by mail, which is no longer necessary, given the technology we currently have available.

Rationale:

(c) It is not always feasible for the Commandant to take additional travel time to drive to events that he/she is required to attend. Allowing the reimbursement of a standard air fare may encourage Marines currently in the work force or those with a more limited budget to potentially move up to the Commandant role and fulfil those duties as required. It will be a slightly higher cost to the Department but would only be required if/when MidWinter or National Conventions are held in the Western and more distant states in the Southern, Central and Eastern Quadrants. Most of the travel within the Southeast Division is within a 12-hour drive, with the exception of the farthest east of South Carolina to the farthest west of Louisiana.

Overall, outlining the reimbursed travel for the Department Commandant allows potential leadership to understand the outlay they have as Department Commandant and what requirements are expected of them.



Toys for Tots/Tim Callahan (absent read by Helen Breen).

The Department of South Carolina now has 12 Toys For Tots Foundation authorized programs, having added two new Detachment sponsored programs in 2022, one in Gaffney and one in Spartanburg. Two other programs saw individuals advance to the lead coordinator role in their programs while coordinators in two other counties were replaced.

Our Detachment programs distributed 101,885 toys to 21,709 children, accounting for 24.1% of the toys distributed and 29.4% of the children who received toys in South Carolina.

Those Detachment programs collected 67,823 toys, 2,516 books, and 13,737 stocking stuffers. (The difference between collection numbers and distribution numbers are toys carried forward from a previous year as well as toys sent to programs directly from the TFT Foundation or toy manufacturers).

Our largest program is Detachment 1123, Olde English Leathernecks, which distributed 22,838 toys to 6,010 children.

When you look at the percentage changes from the 2021 program year to the 2022 program year there are three Detachments whose programs showed the largest change year over year, Lancaster Det 1169, Pee Dee Det 1219, and Rock Hill Det 1123.

Rock Hill showed the largest overall growth at a 75.5% growth in toys distributed and a corresponding 5% growth in the number of children served.

Congratulations to Jeff Tanguay from Rock Hill, April Silvia from Lancaster, and Greg Ohanasian from Pee Dee for their accomplishments.
